Nahvid Etedali, DVM, DACVIM (SAIM) to Launch Dialysis Program at AMC

(New York, NY – October 3, 2018) The Animal Medical Center today announced the appointment of Nahvid Etedali, DVM, DACVIM (SAIM) to Staff Doctor in its Internal Medicine Service.
