## **Veterinarian Tools**



### **Bandages and Gauze**

Bandages and gauze help cover wounds.



#### Needle

Needles help give vaccines or draw blood.



## Stethoscope

Stethoscopes help vets listen to an animal's heart and breathing.



#### Medicine

Medicine helps animals feel better.



#### Collar

Collars stop animals from licking wounds.



### **Otoscope**

Otoscopes help vets look inside of an animal's ears.

# **Arts & Crafts**

#### **Decorative Band-Aids**

Materials: band aids, non-toxic markers, stickers, washi tape

• If you have spare Band-Aids, let your toddler practice their fine motor skills by decorating a few with the art materials you have at home!

#### "Trip to the Veterinarian" Felt Board

Materials: felt, cardboard or poster board, hot glue, scissors

- Felt boards are a fun way for your toddler to create art pieces without the mess!
- First, you will need to make your own <u>DIY Felt Board</u>. You can do this by hot gluing a large piece of felt to cardboard or poster board.
- For a "Trip to the Veterinarian" themed felt board, make felt pieces such as: a cat, a dog, a thermometer, a stethoscope, a collar, bandages, etc.
- Let your child decorate the felt board with these new pieces for a fun and engaging afternoon activity!



## **Sensory Activities**

#### **Animal Bath Time**

Materials: bathtub or plastic container, soap, water, plastic animal toys

• Let your child give the animals visiting the vet a nice bath!

Materials: band-aids, animal toys

# **Arts & Crafts**

#### **DIY Stethoscope**

Materials: funnel, paper towel tube, tape, markers, stickers

• Follow this <u>fun craft idea for a DIY Stethoscope</u>. All you'll need to do is tape a funnel to the end of a paper towel tube and let your child decorate.

#### **DIY Collars**

Materials: felt, velcro/buttons, fabric glue, scissors

- The <u>collars used by veterinarians</u>, also known as Elizabethan collars or E-collars, are tools used by veterinarians to prevent animals from licking or biting at healing wounds.
- Your child can create collars for their very own stuffed animals. Create
  a funnel/cone shape with felt and cut the tip off. Then, attach velcro or
  buttons to the sides so they can easily be opened and closed.
- Let your child cut out decorative pieces of felt and glue them onto the personalized collars for their stuffed animals.



## Games

#### **Veterinary Clinic**

Materials: stuffed animals, pretend veterinary tools, child scrubs

- Set up a "vet clinic" for the stuffed animals in your home!
- There are endless possibilities. You can:
  - Practice bandaging using strips of fabric
  - Give "medicine" with empty cups or pom pom ball "pills"
  - Use your hands to search for ticks and fleas in your animal's fur
  - Write your diagnosis and findings on a clipboard
  - Use a magnifying glass or other tool to closely examine the patient
