Viewing Your Pet's Remains

You may view your pet's remains at the time of death or schedule a viewing at a later time. If you choose to schedule a viewing, please contact AMC's Services for Deceased Pets at 212-329-8757 at least six hours prior to your desired time. When you schedule a viewing, your pet will be bathed and groomed prior to the viewing.

Making Arrangements for Burial or Cremation

If you choose a burial or private cremation for your pet, you must contact a company directly to arrange the details, including payment. There are many companies that provide these services, and you are free to work with the company of your choice. AMC recommends the companies listed below. Please contact AMC's Services for Deceased Pets (212-329-8757) to notify us of your arrangments within 72 hours of your pet's death.

Communal (Group) Cremation
