Day 1: Types of Animals Veterinarians Treat

Goal: To identify major animal groups and the variety of animals that veterinarians treat.

Daily Activity: Create Your Own Animal

Participants will have the chance to create any animal of their choosing, or even make up their own animal if they wish, using any arts & craft materials.

Recommended Materials List:

Construction paper

Colored pencils/markers/crayons

Glue

Scissors

Clay/Play-Doh/Model Magic

Craft fur

Craft feathers

Faux leather

Googly eyes

Day 2: Exploring Inside the Body

Goal: To learn the different diagnostic tools used to examine the inside of an animal's body.

Daily Activity: Designing X-Rays

Participants will create their very own "x-rays" using household craft materials. Cotton swabs or pipe cleaners can act as bones and be arranged into the shape of their desired animal/body part.

Recommended Materials List:

Black construction paper

Cotton swabs and/or white pipe cleaners

Glue

Scissors

(Optional) White crayons/colored pencils

^{**}All materials listed for Day 1 are recommended ideas, not necessities. Your child can create their own animal using any available craft supplies in the home.



Day 3: Treating a Patient

Goal: To understand different treatment options for patients and how veterinarians prioritize emergency cases.

Daily Activity: Treating a Patient

Participants will follow along with the instructor on how to bandage an injury and check vital signs.

Recommended Materials List:

Stuffed animal/toy
Popsicle sticks
Gauze roll or strips of fabric
Scissors

Day 4: Keeping Pets Healthy

Goal: To discuss animal needs and the importance of enrichment.

Daily Activity: Enrichment Creation

Participants will be creating an enrichment toy for their family pet. We have listed material options for a potential dog toy or cat toy. This is an open-ended activity and is not limited to the toy ideas listed below. If your family has a pet other than a cat or a dog, we have a list of different enrichment ideas here:

If you do not have a family pet, we have an option to create a bird feeder.

Recommended Materials List: Dog Rope Toy

Fleece or old t-shirts, scissors, safety pin or rubber band

Recommended Materials List: Cat Feather Toy

String/yarn, scissors, craft feathers, wooden stick, glue, tape

Recommended Materials List: Bird Feeder

Bird seed, peanut butter/sunflower butter, cheerios, pipe cleaner, pinecones, toilet paper rolls, string, scissors



Day 5: Training to Become a Veterinarian

Goal: To explore the different career opportunities in veterinary medicine and how to become a veterinarian.

Daily Activity: Surgical Sutures

Participants will practice their hand-eye coordination by learning to tie surgical knots.

Recommended Materials List:

Felt/fabric Yarn/thread Scissors Sewing or yarn needle (Optional) Tweezers
